Developing Your Child



➔ Large and Fine Motor Development

- Develops control of large motor;
E.g. Walks backwards, skips, and runs with agility and speed, and incorporates motor skills into games
- Gains control and balance; walks on beam, jump over objects
- Hops well; maintains an even gate in stepping
- Coordinates movements; climbs well during gym play
- Masters to use scissors
- Builds 3-dimensional block structures
- Disassembles and reassembles play objects
- Enhance basic grasp of right and left
- Draws combined shapes to form pictures and constructions
- Draws persons; prints letters and numbers recognisable by adult
- Zips, buttons, dresses and puts on shoes independently



➔ Language and Communication Development

- Expands vocabulary, speaks with relevant fluency
- Speaks with fuller, more complex sentences
- Shares experience verbally
- Familiarises with songs and rhymes knows the words to many songs
- Remembers lines of simple poems and repeats full sentences and expressions from stories etc...
- Tells and retells stories in sequence
- Speech fluency in expressing ideas
- Identifies alphabet Aa to Zz; writes
- Recognition of simple words; with/without picture aid
- Matching pictures to words
- Spell simple words
- Use descriptive words, prepositions... etc
- Writes words and simple sentences with the facilitator's guide



- Measures objects using standard and non-standard units of measurement
- Places objects in order, sequence events and patterns
- Reads picture graph and time
- Identify money, its value and currency.
- Adds and subtracts within 100
